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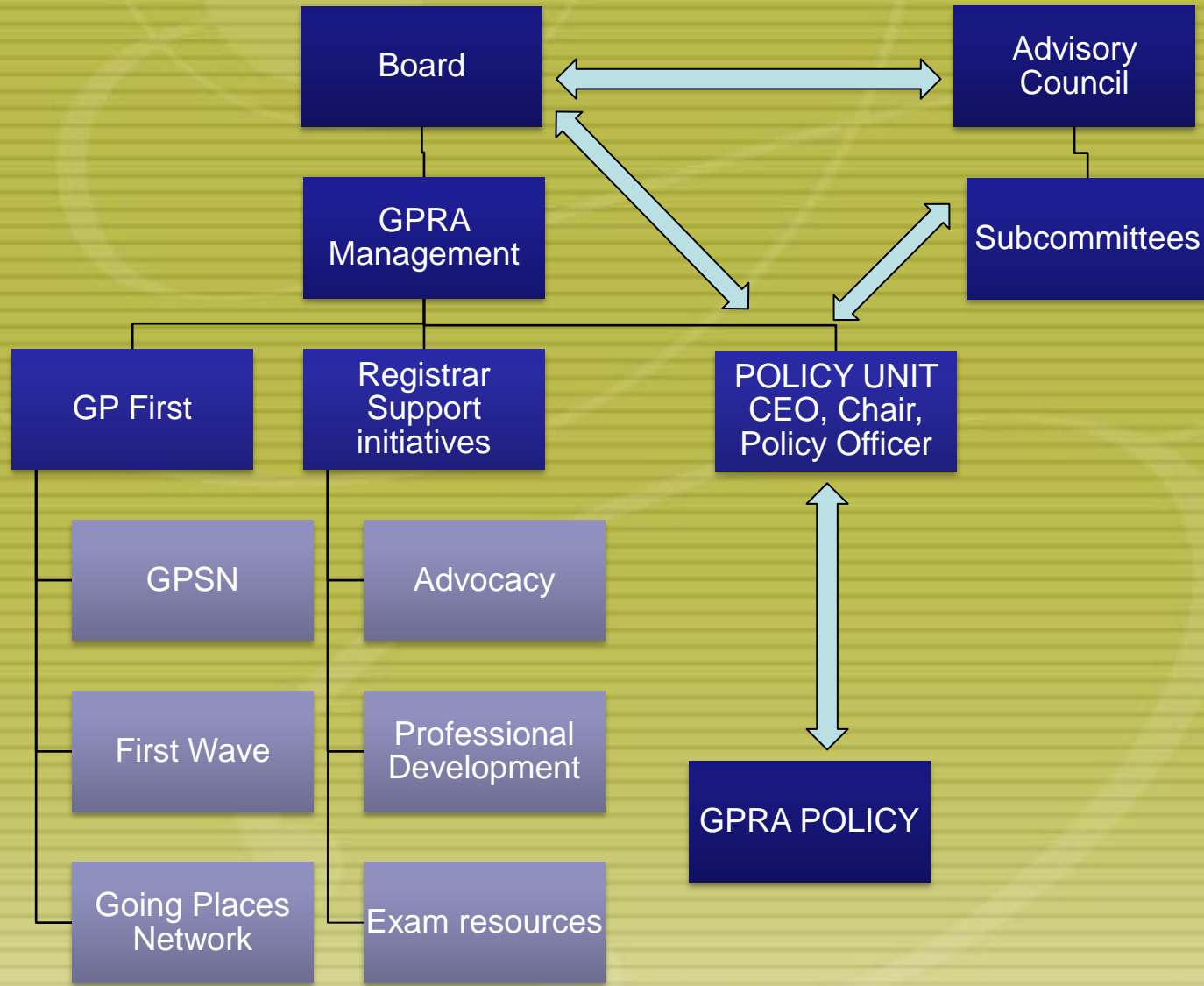

GPSN

- 7000 members as at 30th Sept 2011
- Functional clubs across all 20 universities
- New interactive website launched in Sept
www.gpsn.org.au
- New social media strategy and campaign to be implemented in 2012
- Target membership penetration of 10,000 by 2013

First Wave

- 73 completed scholarships in 2010-11 across 16 universities
- 89 % of last years found this experience useful in helping with future career choice.
- 85% indicated they were more likely to consider GP as a career after completing this program
- 98% would recommend the program to other students
- 103 scholarships awarded in 2011-2012 with 19 universities and 13 RTPs participating

Going Places Network

- 1200 members and expanding
- 47 hospital based GP ambassadors across the country (in 43 teaching hospitals)
- Going places magazine circulation 6000 and expanding.
- New website for junior doctors launched in May 2011 www.gpaustralia.org.au
- Focus on expanding memberships and penetration in next 12 months and integration with RTP activities

researching the next generation

- Gen Y – medical students and pre-voc
- Joint project
- Career aspirations – when and what

- How do different educational/work experiences affect these decisions

Threats

- Pressure to get people into and through the training as soon as possible
- Rapid increase in GP training numbers
- That the existing models of care and care delivery don't change with generational change
- We let someone else set the agenda

Opportunities

- Increased focus on primary care within the health system
- Rapid increase in training numbers
- Generational change
- Opportunity to do things differently and better
